Andrew is Professor of Public International Law at the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies, Geneva. He was the first Director of the Geneva Academy of International Humanitarian Law and Human Rights between 2006 and 2014. He is an expert in international human rights law and public international law. In 2014, Andrew was nominated as an arbitrator under the UN Law of the Sea Convention.

## EXPERIENCE

Andrew has previously worked as Special Adviser on Corporate Responsibility to the High Commissioner for Human Rights and an adviser on international humanitarian law to the Special Representative of the UN Secretary-General in Iraq. He was the representative for Amnesty International at the UN in New York from 1991-1997, and has participated as the representative for Amnesty in numerous inter-governmental meetings and missions to Mozambique, Rwanda, Burundi and Liberia.

His expertise focusses on the international obligations of non-state actors under human rights law and under international humanitarian law. He has published several leading texts on international relations, international law and human rights. He has been involved in several cases involving the European Convention on Human Rights, including the case of *Osman v UK*. He has advised the Government of Solomon Islands on the drafting of the Statute of the International Criminal Court and represented the International Commission of Jurists in the negotiations for amending the Rome Statute to include the crime of aggression.

As Professor of Public International Law at the Graduate Institute of International Studies in Geneva, Andrew teaches human rights law, humanitarian law and public international law.
